PROFESSOR RUTH GILBERT, *Professor of Epidemiology at the Institute of Child Health. Author of a recent multi-country study exploring the prevalence of child maltreatment and asking the question "are we making an impact on the incidence of child maltreatment?".*

PROFESSOR JANE BARLOW, *University of Warwick, Professor of Early Intervention. Extensive research studies on the value of introducing early intervention approaches to prevent child maltreatment.*

DONALD FINDLATER, *from The Lucy Faithfull Foundation. Director of the "Stop it Now!" programme to address child sexual abuse issues in the community, asks whether a multi level intervention could be developed to prevent sexual harm to children.*
